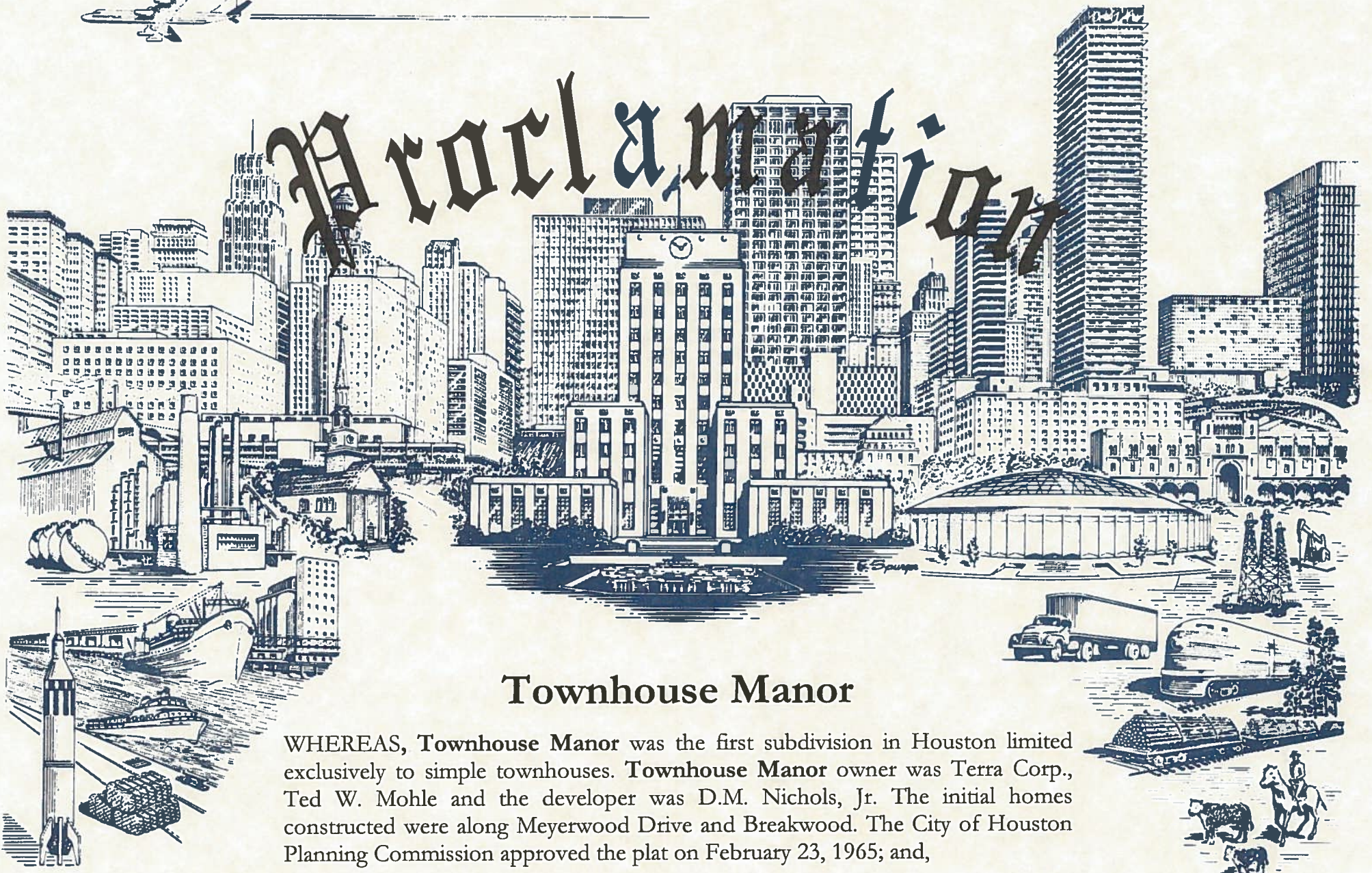




Proclamation



Townhouse Manor

WHEREAS, **Townhouse Manor** was the first subdivision in Houston limited exclusively to simple townhouses. **Townhouse Manor** owner was Terra Corp., Ted W. Mohle and the developer was D.M. Nichols, Jr. The initial homes constructed were along Meyerwood Drive and Breakwood. The City of Houston Planning Commission approved the plat on February 23, 1965; and,

WHEREAS, **Townhouse Manor** was a carefully planned, true townhouse development, with all of the charm, comfort and quality that can be obtained only with overall architectural control; and,

WHEREAS, **Townhouse Manor** is home to the three "Style in Steel" townhouses that were built for the January 1969 National Homebuilders Show held in the six-year old Astrodome complex. It was viewed by over 10,000 conventioners during that show. In 1998, it was awarded the 25th Houston American Institute of Architects award. In 2007, the three townhouses were granted Protected Landmark Status by the City of Houston. These are the first townhouses and the first project younger than 50 years to be granted this status; and,

WHEREAS, on October 17, 2015, the **Townhouse Manor** will celebrate its 50th anniversary of serving the community. The City of Houston commends those who celebrate **Townhouse Manor** and its historical role and extends best wishes to all for a rewarding event.

THEREFORE, I, Annise D. Parker, Mayor of the City of Houston, hereby proclaim October 17, 2015, as

Townhouse Manor Day

in Houston, Texas.
